Projects

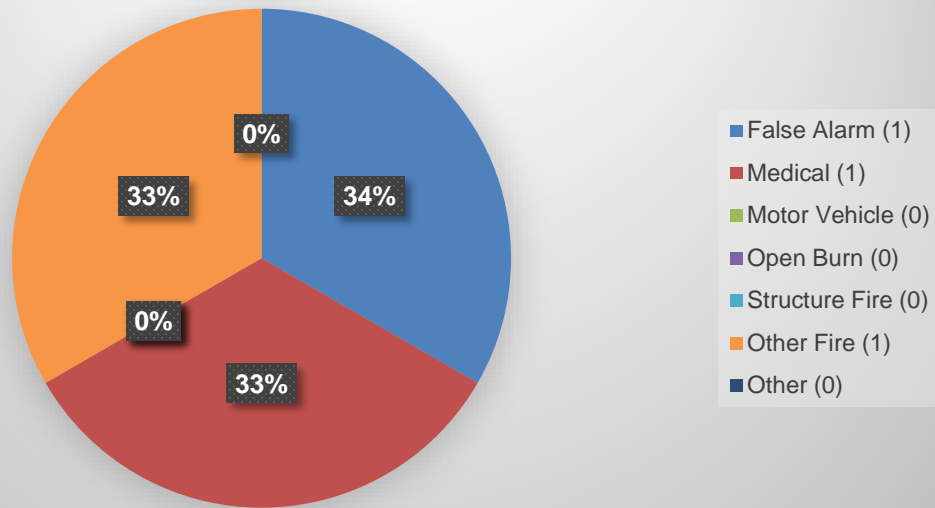

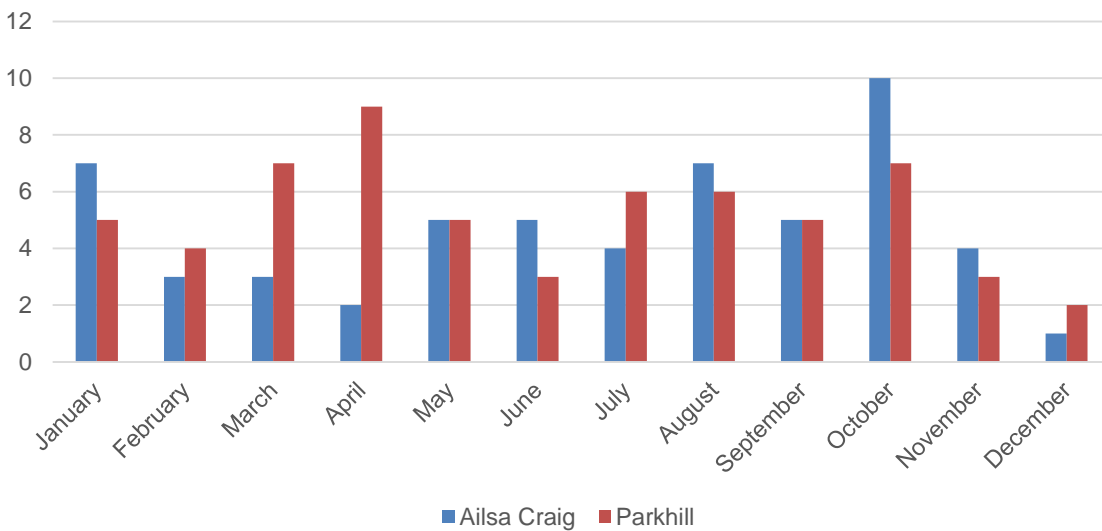

Calls by Type of Alarm for December 2018



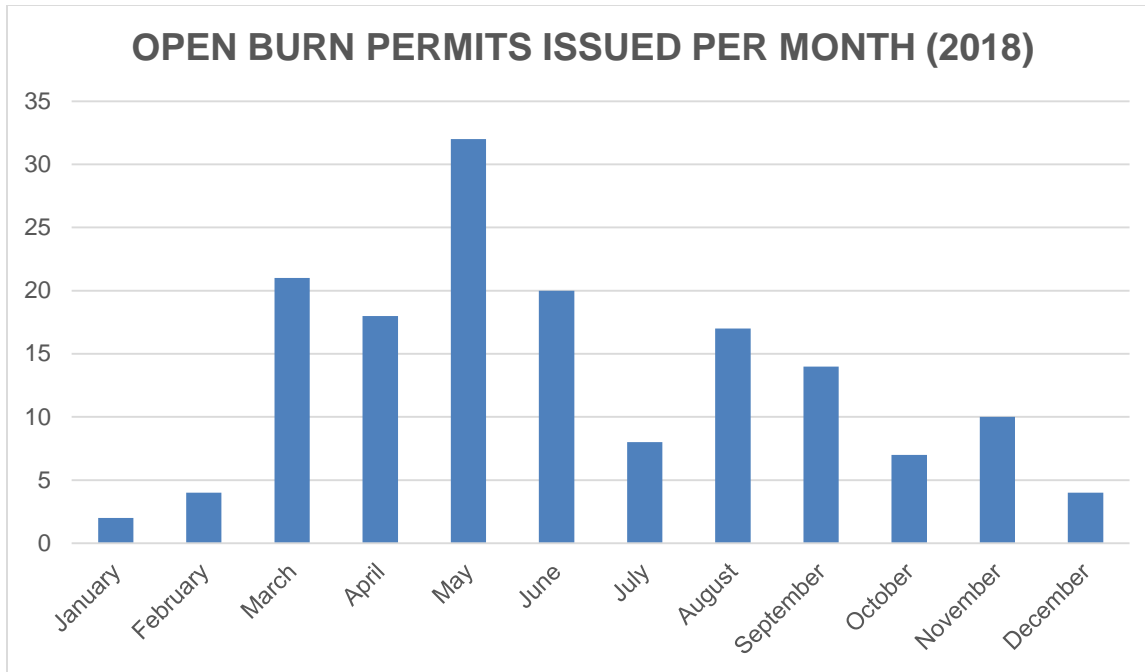
CALLS BY STATION 2018 (INCLUDING SECOND STATION RESPONSE)
